	Matthew 1:21	“She will give birth to a son, and you are to give Him the name <u>Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins.</u> ”	God sent His son, Jesus, to save us from our sins. God keeps His promises.
	Matthew 4:4	“Jesus answered, ‘It is written: <u>‘Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.’</u> ”	God sends us the Holy Spirit to help us. God helps us to resist when we are tempted.
	Matthew 5:3-6	“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. <u>Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.</u> ”	Jesus teaches us to obey Him with our heart and attitude.
	Matthew 5:7-10	“ <u>Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.</u> Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. <u>Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God.</u> Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.”	God wants us to seek His kingdom and trust Him.
	Matthew 5: 11-12	“ <u>Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven,</u> for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.”	God is wise and shares His wisdom with us.
	Psalms 77:13-14	“ <u>Your ways, O God, are holy.</u> What god is so great as our God? You are the God who performs miracles; You display your power among the peoples.”	Jesus has power over everything that threatens us. Jesus has the authority to forgive sins.

	<b>Matthew 9:37-38</b>	“Then He said to His disciples, <u>‘The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest field.’</u> ”	God calls us to follow Him and share His love with others. God sends us out to help Him build His kingdom.
	<b>Matthew 11:28-29a</b>	“Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will <u>give you rest</u> . Take my yoke upon you and learn from me.”	Jesus proves that He is the Messiah. Jesus cares about those who are weary (tired out).
	<b>Matthew 6:33</b>	“ <u>But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness</u> , and all these things will be given to you as well.”	Jesus teaches us about the kingdom of heaven. Jesus wants us to read the Word and live it out everyday.
	<b>Psalm 55:22</b>	“ <u>Cast your cares on the Lord and He will sustain you</u> ; He will never let the righteous fall.”	Jesus cares for us and is able to provide for our needs. We can trust Jesus and what He says.
	<b>Matthew 16:16</b>	“Simon Peter answered, <u>‘You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.’</u> ”	Jesus is the Christ. Jesus is God’s son.
	<b>Matthew 19:14</b>	“Jesus said, ‘Let the little <u>children come to me</u> , and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.’”	God forgives us, and wants us to do the same for others. God loves me and cares for me.
	<b>Matthew 22:37-39</b>	“Jesus replied: <u>Love the Lord your God with all your heart</u> and with all your soul and with your entire mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: <u>Love your neighbor as yourself.</u> ”	God wants us to love Him and others. We should love others and put them first.  JOY is loving Jesus, others, Yourself
	<b>Matthew 24:12-13</b>	“Because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most will grow cold, but <u>he who stands firm to the end will be saved.</u> ”	God prepares us to do His work. God knows when Jesus will return, and wants us to be ready for it – Second Coming!
	<b>Ephesians 1:7</b>	“ <u>In Him (Jesus) we have redemption (safety) through His blood, the forgiveness of sins</u> , in accordance with the riches of God’s grace.”	Jesus prepared to give His life for all people. Jesus taught us to remember Him when we take Communion.
	<b>Matthew 26:39</b>	“Going a little farther, He fell with His face to the ground and prayed, ‘My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. <u>Yet not as I will, but as You will.</u> ”	Jesus prayed for God’s will to be done. Jesus chose to follow God’s plan for our salvation.
	<b>Matthew 16:24</b>	“Then Jesus said to His disciples, <u>‘If anyone would come after me, He must deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me.’</u> ”	Jesus followed God even when others did not. Jesus remained faithful (true) to God.

	<b>Matthew 27:22a</b>	<u>“What shall I do, then, with Jesus who is called Christ?”</u>	Jesus did not fight back when others did wrong to Him. Jesus wants us to choose to follow Him.
	<b>John 3:16</b>	<u>“For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.”</u>	Jesus suffered and died so that everyone would be saved from sin. Jesus loved us enough to die for our sins.
	<b>Matthew 28:19-20</b>	<u>“Therefore go (and tell others about Me) and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.”</u>	Jesus rose from the dead, proving His power over death. Jesus wants us to tell others about who He is.
